We want to reassure everyone that the Town does not direct or decide which haulers are used by our property owners—those are private business relationships. We ask that haulers not introduce additional livestock waste beyond what is already present in Town, and that if a property is to receive livestock waste, it does so within parameters set by the Health Department and the state to protect the water supply, and only after receiving prior approval. That is why the Town requires haulers to use designated waste sites permitted or registered as required by the state, except for limited amounts generated by agricultural operations. There are no designated sites in the Town at this time.

Our goal is simply to support the rural lifestyle we all cherish. Because Loxahatchee Groves is such a unique community, where virtually all homes and farms rely on private wells and septic systems, we have a responsibility to protect our water supply.

When we enforce state statutes or local rules, it is never about making things difficult for our agricultural property owners or the enterprises and organizations that support them. It is about balancing necessary agricultural activities with the health, safety, and welfare of neighbors and the broader community.

We are proud of our Town's agricultural heritage and are committed to working together to keep it thriving and safe.

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
